The two leads will be joined on stage by the film's new producers and director.

The lovely and talented Kate Beckinsale also returns to Hall H this year, for a look into the dark world of Vampires and Lycans during the panel discussion with the directors and producers of the upcoming 3D film "Underworld Awakenings" — the fourth installment of the "Underworld" saga.

Promoting the Sony Pictures remake of "Total Recall" will be actors Colin Farrell, Kate Beckinsale, Jessica Biel, John Cho, and the brilliant Bryan Cranston of the Emmy Award winning series "Breaking Bad" on AMC.

Actor Nicolas Cage will return to Comic-Con to discuss his new sequel to "Ghost Rider" and producer Edgar Wright of "Shaun of the Dead" and "Hot Fuzz," along with the directors and cast, will be on hand to discuss and present scenes from "Attack the Block" — about tough inner-city kids fighting off savage aliens in a South London apartment complex.

More pop culture than comic, Sunday highlights largely revolve around the tube. In the A.M., stars, creators, and producers of the TV show "Glee" will appear in Hall H for a panel discussion and sneak preview of "Glee — the 3D Concert Movie." BBC America will also be presenting footage from the new season of "Doctor Who" — set to premiere later this Summer. And later, Danny DeVito will light up the room with his witty and charismatic charm during a panel discussion with the cast of FX's "It's Always Sunny in Philadelphia."

Actor Jonah Hill of "Superbad" and "Get Him to the Greek" will appear in Room 25ABC wearing his executive producer/creator hat for FOX's new animated series "Allen Gregory," about a pretentious 7-year-old. Voice cast for this series includes French Stewart from the former NBC series "Third Rock from the Sun."

If you survive all four days of comic cult mania, a good way to wrap up the day will be with author Max Brooks of "The Zombie Survival Guide" in Room 7AB.

It's also important not to lose sight of the creators of the comic-book phenomenon. Ultimately, it's the comic book writers and artists that gave rise to what Comic-Con has become. Many of them will be on site to showcase what they do best. Show your thanks by squeezing them into your day while attending Comic-Con.
